

GT Triple Double HOOK: Dai Riki 730-14 THREAD: UTC 70 black HACKLE: Grizzly fore and aft, brown center SEGMENTS: black hare, purple dubbing

<u>Substitutions:</u> Purple is the original color, but this fly can work with other "hotspot" colors like orange or chartreuse.

<u>Fishing Tips</u>: It's part ant, part midge cluster, and part attractor, originally a local favorite on the Green River in Utah. Leave it bushy for choppy water, or trim the bottom hackle to make it a low rider that displays the abdomen/segments in the surface film for picky fish in smooth water.

Tying Tips

- 1. Start thread, and staying on the straight part of the hook, tie in the aft grizzly hackle. 3 turns is enough.
- 2. Dub a tight ball of black dubbing, but don't crowd the middle of the shank where the brown hackle goes.
- 3. Tie in brown hackle mid shank. Don't crowd the rear hackle. 3 turns is enough.
- 4. Dub a tight ball of purple dubbing, but don't crowd the eye where your fore-grizzly goes, and don't crowd the brown hackle. **TIP: Purposely make the purple segment a bit bigger than the black.**
- 5. Tie in grizzly fore-hackle. 3 turns is enough.
- 6. Whip finish.
- 7. OPTIONAL: Trim hackle on bottom half.
